Preface

This edition of the Official League Rules & Bylaws of the Mimosa Sunday Football League contains all current rules governing the participation of fantasy football that are in effect for the 2018 MSFL season.

Member clubs of the League may amend the rules from time to time, pursuant to the applicable voting procedures of the MSFL rulebook (outlined herein, Section I). These bylaws will be updated annually in order to reflect specific dates of importance, particularities to that season or changes to rules and regulations. Any intra-League dispute or call for interpretation in connection with these rules will be decided by the Commissioner of the League, whose ruling will be final, following approval and ratification of this constitution. All rules contained in this document shall apply uniformly to all participating teams and affiliated management. At many places in the text there are approved rulings which serve to supplement and illustrate the basic language of the rules (to be designated in writing with subsequent abbreviations when such instances occur).

Where the word “illegal” appears in this rule book, it is an institutional term of art pertaining strictly to actions that violate MSFL participation rules. It is not meant to connote illegality under any public law or the rules or regulations of any other organization. The word “flagrant,” when used here to describe an action by a manager, is meant to indicate that the degree of a violation of the rules is extremely objectionable, conspicuous, unnecessary, avoidable, or gratuitous. “Flagrant” in these rules does not necessarily imply malice on the part of the identified manager.

The structure of each element contained in this document is a standard Section-Article-Clause, with amendments and assumptions marked by a superscripted, corresponding number (*) and detailed in the footnotes of the page on which they appear.



Section I

Procedures

Article i, Presumptions

I.i.1 It is understood that by participating in the Mimosa Sunday Football League (henceforth referred to as 'League'), all managers agree to abide by the rules and regulations set forth in this document, and in subsequent, corresponding documents in the coming years, so long as the League continues to exist, in perpetuity

I.i.2 At no point shall the rights of participating managers outlined in this constitution (or in any subsequent amendments) be infringed upon by participating managers, the sitting Commissioner or any other body, governing or otherwise

I.i.3 All managers agree to treat one another with a common level of respect, unless a particular manager is being a dick, acting like an idiot, or clearly making moves without any regard as to how it impacts his/her team and/or the League in general

I.i.4 The term 'In-Season' shall be used to refer to the period from the moment the draft begins (2018 MSFL Draft to take place on Saturday, September 1, 8PM) to the moment the final Playoff matchup concludes (December 30, 2018)

I.i.5 The term 'Active Week' shall be used to refer to the period during in-season play that runs from Thursday (start of TNF) to Monday (end of MNF)

I.i.6 All managers agree to buy-in the total amount, payable at the Draft (see I.iii.16). For the 2018 season, the buy-in is \$150 CAD

Article ii, Voting

I.ii.1 Participating managers agree to a democratic system of decision-making, whereby issues, complaints and rule changes that may have an impact on League proceedings are put to a vote and decided upon by vast majority rule¹²

I.ii.2 In instances where issues/debates/arguments/challenges arise (either between managers or within the League as a construct) and participating managers cannot come

to a unanimous, agreed-upon decision as to how the event should proceed, a vote will be cast and the result of this vote shall be binding and amended in these bylaws

I.ii.3 During in-season play, a 48-hour voting period shall be allotted, and the resulting ruling shall be decided based on whether the issue at hand receives at least and no fewer than two votes less the total number of voters (e.g. If a contested waiver claim debate is put to vote, and 9 managers participate, at least 7 must rule in favor of the complainant for the proposal to be approved). This shall henceforth be referred to as *Vast Majority Rule*³

I.ii.4 During in-season play, if fewer than half of the managers vote on a proposed issue, the issue shall be tabled until further interest in the matter can be garnered by the complainant

I.ii.5 During in-season play, in order to execute a rule change, thereby amending the bylaws outlined herein, a unanimous decision made by *all* participating managers must be reached (without the option for Vast Majority Rule)

I.ii.6 During in-season play, calls for a rule change shall be given a seven (7) day grace period during which managers can vote

I.ii.7 During in-season play, approved rule changes will be put into effect *immediately* and shall be enforced during the next week of matchups

I.ii.8 If a seven (7) day grace period for voting falls into an active week, then the approved changes will take effect the following week of matchups (without impacting the current week)

Article iii, Draft

I.iii.1 The 2018 League draft is set to take place on Saturday, September 1, 2018 beginning at 8PM at 4965 Queen Mary Road, Apartment 410 in Montreal, Quebec, Canada, North America, Western Hemisphere, Earth, Earth-Moon System, Terrestrial Planets, Solar System, Orion Arm, Milky Way Galaxy, Virgo Supercluster, Observable universe, Universe

I.iii.2 In order to be eligible to draft, all managers must have a physical presence at League drafts⁴

³ If a manager does not vote within the 48-hour allotted voting period, he or she willingly forfeits his or her right to vote on the given issue

⁴ A 'physical presence' can be defined as the sole manager, both co-managers, one of two co-managers (discussed in Section II) or a pre-designated proxy (not already a member of the league) present at the draft. A manager that cannot fulfill this criteria in any of the outlined capacities must forfeit his or her team.



I.iii.3a The first pick of the 2018 draft for the 2018-19 season will be determined by the first place winner of the Mimosa Sunday Football March Madness Bracket Tournament. Each manager will create his/her/their bracket in an effort to place first according to Yahoo! Tourney Pick Em' rankings. The League has agreed that the final standings shall indicate the first overall pick, based on the first place winner of the bracket tournament.

I.iii.3b The remaining slots for the draft order for the 2018-19 season (slots 2-12) will be determined via a random, blind selection process whereby the League Commissioner will livestream, on Facebook within the League Facebook group, the random selection of manager names from a hat. The names will determine draft order in descending order, with the first name picked corresponding to the last pick of the draft, and working up until the last name picked represents the first selection in the draft. The resulting list, in the reverse order in which it is chosen, makes up draft positions 2-12.

I.iii.4 In order for participatory or activity-based draft order determination practices to be implemented in a given season, a vast majority must be reached by way of a vote in support of changing the processes outlined in I.iii.3a and I.iii.3b, and absentee managers at the time must consent to abstaining from the proposed event, accepting their designated draft spot⁵

I.iii.5 Draft round time allotments shall be structured as follows:

Round 1	60 seconds per team (spectacles, music encouraged)
Rounds 2-6	45 seconds per team
Rounds 7+	60 seconds per team

I.iii.6 If time runs out for a given manager in ANY round, the next manager in the sequence can declare a draft pick at any time, whether or not the manager past his/her time has declared a pick (e.g. is Manager A in Round 3 runs past his/her allotted 45 seconds, then Manager B with the subsequent pick can draft a player prior to Manager A, then Manager C with the pick following Manager B, etc.)

I.iii.7 During the draft, all managers are expected to respect the outlined drinking rules and punishments, which will be provided to all teams at the start of the evening

Phone-in drafts are strictly prohibited under any and all circumstances. Unless, you know, you're dead or something, in which case you should probably designate a proxy just to be safe. Oh man, if someone in the League dies then this is gonna look really insensitive. OK - for the record, at the time of writing, everyone in the League is alive and well.

⁵The caveat in this particular case, is that in order for the vote to be valid, all absentee managers must vote or provide explicit consent that a draft order decision process can be changed (based on a voting vast majority)



I.iii.8 If a manager/team does not respect the drinking rules and punishments, then he/she accepts and admits that he/she is a little bitch, and will have to sport that title throughout the remainder of the season⁶

I.iii.9 Rule changes as they apply to drinking rules and punishments do not fall under the same voting provisions as rule changes outlined in Article ii, and do not require the same majorities, unanimity or grace periods. Changes can be declared unilaterally and applied uniformly

I.iii.10 Unless otherwise indicated, the draft is a BYOB event, with the option to bring your own food, eat before or order a meal to be delivered to the residence in question. It is imperative to understand, however, that your allotted draft time in a given round will not be extended based on your order/payment of food, and planning should be done accordingly

I.iii.11 After the eighth (8) round, a 20-minute break will be provided (unless unanimously agreed to skip) to all teams

I.iii.12 During the draft, two 45-second time extensions will be given to pairs of teams if and only if that time extension is being used in order to discuss a trade. These 45-second extensions are shared between the two participating teams (meaning each team can be involved in no more than two extensions) and while there is no cap on the number of trades that can be executed the night of the draft (outlined in I.iii.13) only two of those discussions will allow for the extension of a draft slot

I.iii.13 Trades can be executed in any manner (for players and/or positions) on draft night between any number of teams, so long as all of the parties involved agree to the terms and there are no adverse consequences on the structure of the League, draft or managers⁷

I.iii.14 Draft night trades can only be vetoed if there is unanimous consent to veto the trade by all participating managers *at the time of announcement*. Retroactive veto or disagreement (even if the subsequent retroactive veto results in a unanimous decision) will not be counted, and decisions will not be reversed under any circumstances

I.iii.15 Unless otherwise indicated, the League draft shall take place on the last Saturday prior to the first Thursday night event of the NFL season

I.iii.16 Upon arrival to the draft, all managers must have cash on hand (in the form of \$150 CAD) in order to be eligible for the draft. Online money transfers are not accepted as a form of payment

I.iii.17 Draft order is to be announced one month prior to the official draft⁸

Article iv, Disputes

I.iv.1 All managers concede that disputes at the outset or during the active in-season period shall be put to a vote

I.iv.2 All managers agree to respect the voting rules outlined in Section I, Article ii

I.iv.3 In the event that there is a tie in voting, then there will be no change to an existing rule or structure, as a *vast majority* has not been reached, as described in I.ii.3

I.iv.4 Should a rule change or dispute, which has been put to a vote, not be passed, it will be the responsibility of the manager proposing the rule change or presenting the dispute to reach out to each of the League managers before calling for a second vote, which will need unanimous consent in order to move forward

I.iv.5 Disputes as they relate to manager negligence or oversights shall not be heard by the League and will not be eligible for change (with no option for a vote)

I.iv.6 Disputes as they relate to honor system-type requests (see II.ii.3) where no reasonable expectations can be presumed by a manager will not be heard by the League and will not be eligible for change (with no option for a vote)

I.iv.7 Disputes that have been resolved (whether or not in favor of the complainant) can be continually debated on one of the messaging systems in place (Yahoo and Facebook) though they will no longer be considered for a vote following a resolution without a predetermined unanimous decision (see I.iv.4)

Section II

Transactions

Article i, Free Agency Acquisition Budget (FAAB)

II.i.1 All managers concede that the Mimoso Sunday Football League is a free-agency acquisition budget (FAAB) structured League, and that free agency acquisition is conducted via a silent auction process each week

II.i.2 All managers concede that at the beginning of each season, each team will be awarded \$150 (of fictional currency within the Yahoo system) that can be used throughout the season in order to bid on free agents

II.i.3 All managers concede that should a team's budget be wiped out, no replenishing options will be made available⁹

II.i.4 Managers have the right to bid any amount for a given player, but are aware of the fact that the full amount of what was bid is paid, and not simply an incremental increase over the last highest bid¹⁰

II.i.5 Managers understand that there is no monetary value to the currency, and that they will not be awarded the remaining budget at the end of the season¹¹

Article ii, Free Agency

II.ii.1 All managers agree that following the clearing of waivers (Section II, Article ii) any player available in the free agency pool can be claimed on a first come, first served basis

II.ii.2 Disputes regarding claims in free agency will not be heard, as this is an open market and dictated according to the functionality of the Yahoo system

II.ii.3 Managers who claim a free agent via a messaging system, asking other managers to refrain from claiming a player (as the requesting manager may not be in a position to claim a player right away) have *no reasonable expectation* that managers will abide by the request. Managers with disputes in such cases should refer to II.i.2

Article iii, Waivers

II.iii.1 All managers agree that waiver priority shall be set by the Yahoo systems, and that no official disputes regarding waiver priority will have merit within the league

II.iii.2 In the event that two teams bid on a prospective free agent for the same amount, the tie breaker will be awarded to the team with a higher waiver priority

II.iii.3 In the event that a manager places a bid on a free agent and wins the auction only to discover that they had accidentally chosen the wrong player, it is understood that no adjustments can be made by the league, and that the executed transaction will not be overturned

II.iii.4 If a player is unintentionally dropped and placed on waivers by a manager, there is no option for League adjustments, and this manager will be forced to bid on the waived player along with the other managers in the hopes of re-acquiring the lost player

II.iii.5 All managers concede to a 2-day waiver period monitored and enforced via the Yahoo systems

Article iv, Keepers

II.iv.1 All managers concede that the League will be structured as a Keeper-style league, beginning in the 2016 season and for all seasons moving forward in perpetuity

II.iv.2 Each team will be allotted one Keeper from the prior season (for this season, each team will be allotted one Keeper from the 2017-2018 season)

II.iv.3 The Keeper for each team *must be announced* no later and not before exactly one week prior to the draft (which, for the 2018 season, is Saturday, August 25, 2018). On this day, all teams must share their selected Keeper with the rest of the League within the League Facebook group

II.iv.4 At the draft, the Keeper selected will be awarded to the team in the position in which the Keeper was selected in the previous year's draft. For example, if a manager drafted his/her Keeper in the first round the previous year (or, the chosen Keeper was acquired in a trade or off the waiver wire, and had originally been drafted in the first

round) then that Keeper will be used as that manager's first round pick for the current season. If the Keeper was drafted in the fourth round, then it will be the fourth round pick, etc. (see II.iv.5 and II.iv.6 for exceptions)

II.iv.5 If a chosen Keeper went undrafted the previous year (with the exception outlined in II.iv.6) and was selected off of the waiver wire over the course of the season, then the manager keeping said player will forfeit his/her last round pick in order to keep the selected agent

II.iv.6 The Jordy Nelson Rule stipulates that in cases where a star player (that would certainly be drafted in a high position) is injured or suspended prior to the start of the season and goes undrafted in fantasy leagues, managers cannot claim this player off waivers to be used as a Keeper in the following year as their final draft spot. These players will remain in the pool at the draft, and can be drafted by any team, regardless as to whether or not a manager selected the player at the end of the season in the hopes of retaining this agent as a Keeper in the last draft spot (as this is illegal)

II.iv.7 A Keeper can be kept for up to three (3) seasons, and the held Keeper's draft replacement moves from its original position (in the first year kept) to the first round pick by the manager keeping the player for a subsequent year (and all subsequent years thereafter)

II.iv.8 Following the announcement of a team's Keeper (which, for the 2018-19 season, shall take place on Saturday, August 25th, 2018) the Keeper selection is binding. The only instance in which a Keeper can be changed would be in the event of the selected player's injury/suspension/inability to play following the selection and prior to the draft. Once the draft begins, the Keeper selection is binding and cannot be changed under any circumstances.

II.iv.9 In the event that a manager(s) abdicates his/her spot in the League, the replacing manager(s) shall inherit the departing manager's end-of-season roster for the previous season. From this roster, the incoming manager(s) shall be able to choose his/her Keeper, abiding by the same rules laid out for all incumbent managers, as dictated by the League Rules and Bylaws inscribed above regarding Keepers (Section II, Article iv).

Article v, Trades

II.v.1 There are no restrictions as to the type and scope of trades that can be offered, accepted and made by any and all participating teams within the League, so long as the



elements involved in the trade are limited to players and all involved parties agree to the outcome¹³

II.v.2 There is no limit to the number of trades that can be executed by any team over the course of the season

II.v.2 Trades will be processed instantaneously after they have been approved by the parties involved

II.v.3 All teams agree that there shall be no veto process involved in any trades agreed upon by participating managers, and that all confirmed trades are at the discretion of the teams involved.

II.v.4 Trades proposed and accepted during an active week will be processed in time for the following active week (and no changes will take effect while an active week is ongoing)

II.v.5 All teams concede to abide by the Trade Deadline set by the League. For the 2018 season, this takes place on November 10, 2018 at 11:59PM ET

II.v.6 All teams agree to approach the Trade Deadline fairly and honestly, and concede not to collude with one another whereby a team that has fallen out of Mimosa Cup contention willfully trades top-tier players to a team in contention for the Mimosa Cup¹⁴

¹³ Trades cannot involve cash, collusion in exchange for non-tangible assets, FAAB (which doesn't work), food (Segalls) or sexual favors (hand stuff; mouth stuff is fine) and cannot involve stipulations that are not sanctioned by the Yahoo systems (i.e. manual elements, such as performance, which cannot be controlled)

¹⁴ In instances where this action is grossly apparent, an automatic veto will be enacted in order to prevent unfair advantages, and *both* teams involved in the trade will be locked until Playoffs begin



Section III

Structure

Article i, League Structure

III.i.1 The Mimosa Sunday Football League is a private, 12-team, full-season fantasy football league operated under the Yahoo Fantasy Sports operating system

III.i.2 The regular season of the League will take place in accordance with the regular National Football League (NFL) season, from Week 1 through Week 13¹⁵

III.i.3 The playoff run will begin each season in Week 14 and continue through Week 16, where the winner of the Mimosa Cup (Section III, Article iii) will be determined via a one-time head-to-head matchup¹⁶

III.i.4 All teams concede that the regular season matchup schedule shall be determined by the Yahoo system in accordance with the specified draft order (I.iii.3)

III.i.5 All teams concede that the teams finishing in first (1) and second (2) place during the regular season will be awarded a Bye in the first week of the Mimosa Cup (Section III, Article iii) playoffs (Week 14)

III.i.6 All teams concede that the teams finishing in seventh (7) and eighth (8) place during the regular season will be awarded a Bye in the first week of the Toilet Bowl (Section III, Article iv) playoffs (Week 14)¹⁷

Article ii, Team Structure

III.ii.1 All League-eligible team rosters are structured in the following way:

- Quarterback (1)
- Wide Receiver (3)
- Running Back (2)
- Tight End (1)
- Flex (2)

Team Defense (1)
Kicker (1)
Bench (5)
Injured Reserve (1)¹⁸

III.ii.2 There are no restrictions as to the makeup of a team's bench, and managers have the right to compile a set of bench players made up of agent's in any position (so long as those positions are eligible according to the rules of the league)

III.ii.3 While teams finishing in ninth (9) through twelfth (12) place will continue to compete in the Toilet Bowl (Section III, Article iv) teams mathematically ineligible for Mimosa Cup series playoff contention shall be restricted in terms of their ability to participate in waiver claims following MNF on Week 13¹⁹

III.ii.4 Restricted teams (see III.ii.3) shall be capable of participating in free agency prior to the start of the playoff series in Week 14 with explicit restrictions (see III.iv.6 for limitations)

Article iii, Mimosa Cup

III.iii.1 All participating managers agree that the League champion (determined via the outlined details in Section III, Article vi) will be awarded the Mimosa Cup, the crowdfunded, communal trophy presented to the League at the 2015 Official Draft

III.iii.2 The Mimosa Cup shall be awarded to the winning team following a playoff series beginning Week 14 and running through Week 16

III.iii.3 The Mimosa Cup playoff series shall be played by the teams finishing in the top six (6) places of the rankings (Section III, Article vi) at the end of the regular season²⁰

III.iii.4 See III.i.5

III.iii.5 The ordering structure of the Mimosa Cup playoff series shall follow the order whereby the top ranked team in a given week shall play the lowest ranked team available in that same given week (e.g. in Week 14, Team 3 will play Team 6, Team 4 will play Team 5)

¹⁸ As the Mimosa Sunday Football League is a Keeper league, there is a designated spot on each team's roster for a player listed on the Injured Reserve. While this slot is not exclusive to Keeper agents, managers can use this slot at the end of the season as an option for an injured player to be held in the off-season (so long as this does not interfere with the Jordy Nelson Rule, II.iv.6)

III.iii.6 Following the Bye in Week 14, Team 1 will compete against the victor from the Team 4/5 matchup, and Team 2 will compete against the victor from the Team 3/6 matchup

III.iii.7 The Mimosa Cup final matchup shall be determined based on the Week 15 victors, and all managers concede that regular season rankings (Section III, Article vi) shall have no impact on the teams involved

III.iii.8 All managers concede to respect the tie breaker mechanisms put in place by the Commissioner via the Yahoo systems (see III.v.5) and understand that objections to these proceedings will not be heard by the League

III.iii.9 Mimosa Cup winners are presented their trophy at the following season's draft, and each winner shall keep the Mimosa Cup in his/her presence for a total of one year (until the following season's draft)

III.iii.10 It is the financial responsibility of the winning manager to engrave the Mimosa Cup with his/her team name and name (last names only for co-managed teams, for spacing purposes) within the possession period²¹

Article iv, Toilet Bowl

III.iv.1 The Toilet Bowl shall be defined as the title given to the team that finishes last in the overall rankings (Section III, Article vi) following the deciding matches in the playoff series

III.iv.2 No trophy shall be supplied by the League, and it would be the responsibility of the Toilet Bowl recipient to acquire a trophy should he/she choose to do so²²

III.iv.3 The Toilet Bowl recipient shall be decided in Week 15 in the matchup of the two teams out of contention from the Mimosa Cup that lose in Week 14 (e.g. If Team 12 loses to Team 9 in Week 14 and Team 11 loses to Team 10 in Week 14, then the Toilet Bowl recipient shall be decided in Week 15 matchup between Team 11 and Team 12)

III.iv.4 The Toilet Bowl title shall be awarded to the losing team in the Week 15 titular matchup described in III.iv.3

²¹ Managers that do not engrave their title in the span of the year in which the Mimosa Cup is in their possession forfeit the opportunity to do so. A request can be made to the new manager in possession of the Mimosa Cup, which would allow for the trophy to be taken for engraving (or engraved with both managers' teams and names at the time of the new engraving) with expenses to be discussed and agreed upon by the two managers in question

²² This will not be an official trophy, and shall remain in the possession of the manager that acquired it, without any League sanction as to the transfer of ownership



III.iv.5 All managers concede to the process and timing of restricting mathematically ineligible teams (see III.ii.3) for the week prior to the playoff series beginning

III.iv.6 Teams will be unlocked following the waiver claim period in Week 14 in order to acquire players from Free Agency

III.iv.7 All managers concede that teams that are restricted leading up to the playoff series (those teams out of contention for the Mimosa Cup and playing in the Toilet Bowl titular series) *shall not* make any waiver claims, and only engage in transactional behavior with Free Agency players after the waivers have cleared²³

III.iv.8 All managers concede that any violations to the stipulations in III.iv.7 shall be immediately reversed, and the guilty party(ies) shall have his/her team locked for the duration of the playoff series (with the option to only set a lineup with the current players on his/her roster)

Article v, Scoring

III.v.1 The Mimosa Sunday Football League is a head-to-head one-half (0.5) point PPR (points-per-reception) league

III.v.2 The offensive scoring system for each available player position is as follows²⁴:

25 Yards Passing (QB)	1 Point
Passing TD (QB)	4
Interception Thrown (QB)	-1
10 Rush Yards (QB,RB,WR,TE)	1
Rush TD (QB,RB,WR,TE)	6

III.v.5 In the rare event that there is a points tie between two teams in a given week, then the tie breaker mechanism shall be based on historical head-to-head matchups, followed by total offensive points, followed by total touchdowns

III.v.6 Should there be a tie between teams at the end of the season (for a specific ranking) then all managers concede to abide by the tie breaker mechanisms set in place by the Yahoo systems, which will rely on season points total, followed by head-to-head-matchups, without any official objection to the result²⁵

Article vi, Rankings

III.vi.1 All managers concede to accept the final team rankings (as determined by matchups during the regular season and playoffs through the Yahoo systems) as official and binding

III.vi.2 Managers recognize that the recipient of the Mimosa Cup shall be the manager who wins all matchups in the Mimosa Cup playoff series (see Section III, Article iii) regardless of where that manager finished in the regular season (so long as the team qualified for the Mimosa Cup playoff series by Week 14)

III.vi.3 Managers recognize that the recipient of the Toilet Bowl title shall be the manager that loses the deciding match (see III.iv.3 and III.iv.4) in the Toilet Bowl titular playoff series, regardless of where that manager finished in the regular season (so long as the team qualified for the Toilet Bowl playoff series by Week 14)

III.vi.4 Head-to-head matchup winners shall be determined on a point basis, with a higher point total team being handed the victory

III.vi.5 Season rankings shall be determined based on a team's record, and shall not be determined by point totals (unless point totals become a weighted factor in the determination of a tie breaker, see III.v.5)

Article vii, Payout

III.vii.1 Each team shall deposit \$150 CAD into the League pot at the outset of the season (see I.i.6) for a pot total of \$1800 CAD unless otherwise specified and agreed upon by all managers

III.vii.2 The payout of the League pot shall be as follows:

Regular Season Champion	\$200 CAD
Mimosa Cup Runner-Up	\$400 CAD
Mimosa Cup Champion	\$1200 CAD

III.vii.3 Should Mimosa Cup finalists wish to come to an agreement as to the divvying of the total pot, the details of this arrangement shall be between the managers in question, and the League will have no authority over its validity, stipulations or processing²⁶
